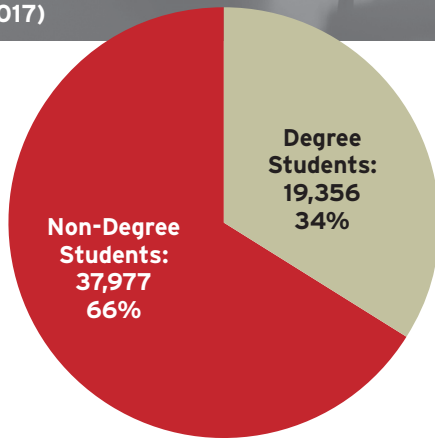
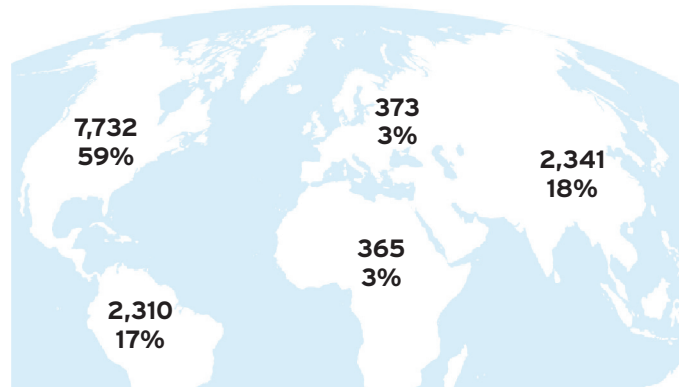


- Over 57,000 students from 148 countries come to LaGuardia Community College each year.
- Established in 1971, LaGuardia has the largest English as a Second Language (ESL) program in New York City.
- Lifetime earnings increase more than \$400,000 for students with an associate degree.
- LaGuardia ranked #5 among U.S. two-year colleges in economic mobility - moving low-income people to the middle class and beyond - in a Stanford University study.
- LaGuardia students are 32% more likely to transfer to a 4-year college than community college students nationally.
- Over the past decade, the LaGuardia Community College Foundation has raised more than \$25 million for scholarships, emergency funds and new initiatives aimed at enhancing student success.
- During the past year, LaGuardia's Business Services Programs have helped 1,845 small businesses grow and created 2,559 jobs.

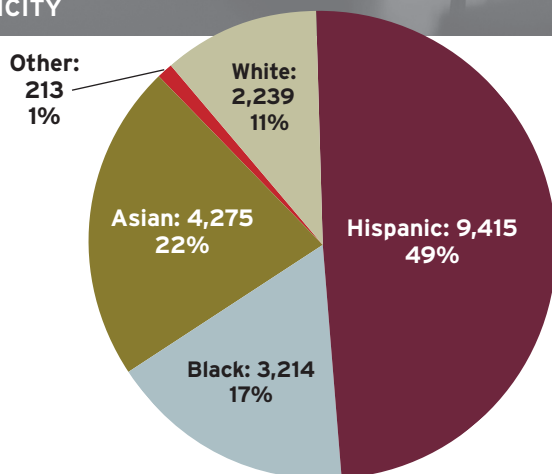

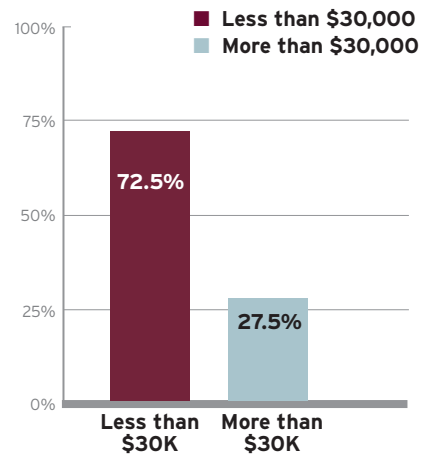
WHERE DO OUR STUDENTS COME FROM?



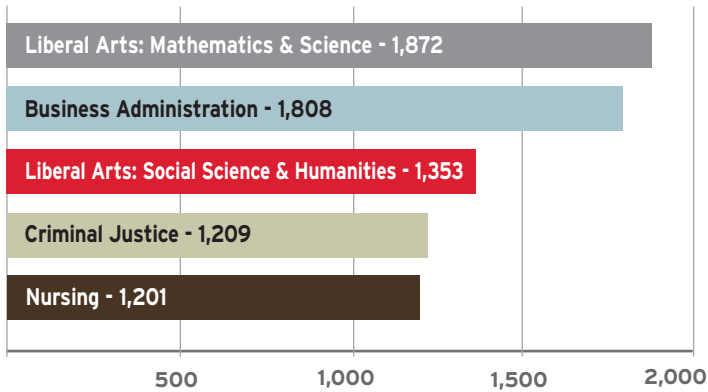
RACE/ETHNICITY



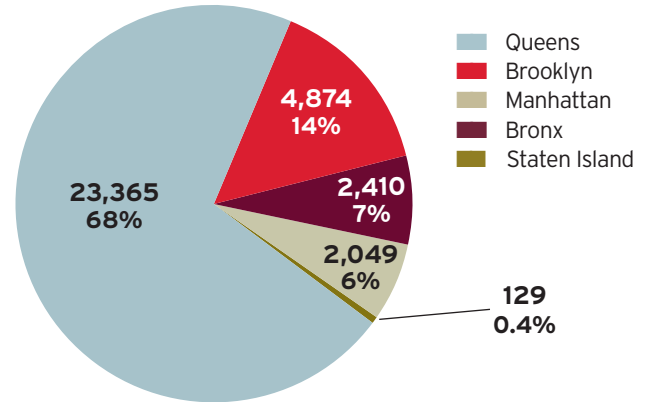
FAMILY INCOME
