MATHEMATICS AND QUANTITATIVE REASONING
Secondary Education students should take MAT115 or
117 to meet NY State Teacher Education requirements
(although Math concentration students will need to take
further math courses). This course is also
recommended by Queens College for students who will
transfer there.

<u>LIFE AND PHYSICAL SCIENCES</u> Students should take SCB101 or SCC101 Topics in Biology or Chemistry. These courses meet NY State Teacher Education requirements and anticipate requirements for those transferring.

PATHWAYS FLEXIBLE CORE (FC) allows students to choose courses based on interests, transfer or career plans, or for general exploration. Associate of Arts students must take one course from each category listed below, plus an additional course from any category. View DegreeWorks or the Pathways website to see a full range of options, or talk with the program director or an advisor. Note: your program has specific recommendations listed below.
