1. Advisor recommendation: Take COM 113 Oral communication at John Jay College to fulfill both the FEF major elective and the General Education College option communications requirement.
2. Required if students do not take SSS100 Introduction to Sociology and ALSO either SSE103 Introduction to Microeconomics or SSE104 Introduction to Macroeconomics for Individual & Society requirement.
3. Required if students do not choose MAT 119 Elementary Algebra and Statistics or MAT120 Elementary Statistics for Mathematical and Quantitative Reasoning requirement.
4. The requirement for ACC 260 Accounting Information Systems can be fulfilled at LaGuardia CC by taking BTA 130 Computer Applications for Accounting.
5. Students pursuing a career as a Certified Public Accountant (CPA) should meet with the program coordinator to plan elective credits and any additional coursework necessary for the CPA exam.

**E. ARTICULATION AGREEMENT FOLLOW-UP PROCEDURES**

**1. Procedures for reviewing, updating, modifying or terminating agreement:**

When either of the degree programs involved in this agreement undergoes a change, the agreement will be reviewed and revised accordingly by faculty from each institution's respective departments, selected by their chairpersons/program directors.

**2. Procedures for evaluating agreement, i.e., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success:**

Every August 1<sup>st</sup> of the year, John Jay will provide the sending institution with the following information: a) the number of students from the sending institution who applied to the program; b) the number of students from the sending institution who were accepted into the program; c) the number of students from the sending institution who enrolled; d) the aggregate GPA of these enrolled students; and the graduation rate of the sending institution who were accepted into the program.


**3. Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement, e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisers, websites, etc.:**


This articulation agreement will be publicized on the websites of both the sending and receiving institutions. Transfer advisors at the sending institution will promote this agreement with eligible students.
