

STUDENT SUPPORT SERVICES

Pursuing an education while balancing work, family and other responsibilities can be challenging. We provide a variety of services to support students' academic, professional and personal success.

Black Male Empowerment Cooperative (BMEC) - Academic support, mentoring, tutoring, personal guidance, networking opportunities to empower students to be successful in and out of college.

Center for Career & Professional Development - Job search and career planning services to land a dream job.

CREAR Futuros - Academic support, mentoring, internship and professional development opportunities for Latino students.

Early Childhood Learning Center - Quality, on-campus care and learning for students' children.

Emergency Assistance - Money to assist with unexpected, short-term hardship.

Foundation Scholarships - Scholarships available ranging from \$500 to \$5,000 to assist continuing students with the cost of tuition, textbooks and fees associated with attending college.

Health Services - Education on maintaining a healthy lifestyle, plus free immunization clinics.

LGBTQIA Safe Zone Hub - Welcoming space for students to feel supported and connect to campus and community resources.

PAYING FOR COLLEGE

Students don't have to break the bank to invest in their future. We offer grants, scholarships, tuition payment plans, on/off campus jobs and information about loans to cover college costs. Students might be surprised to find out how much financial aid they can receive, regardless of their family's income level.

We offer students a combination of financing options to cover their college expenses.

- **Grants and scholarships:** Free money that does not have to be repaid and is usually based on financial need.
- **Federal work-study:** Earned money that allows students to work part-time to earn money for college expenses.
- **Tuition Payment Plan:** Interest-free plan with Nelnet tuition is divided into six lower monthly payments.
- **Loans:** Borrowed money that has to be repaid with interest.

HOW TO APPLY ONLINE

Incoming freshmen students can apply to as many as six CUNY campuses with a single application. The priority application deadline for Fall is February 1 and Spring is September 15.

STEP 1 Get started at laguardia.com/apply.

Students can visit laguardia.edu/apply and click on the "Apply Now" link. This will direct them to the CUNY application page, where they can create an account.

STEP 2 Fill out the online application.

Students will be presented with several pages of questions they will need to complete. We recommend that they fill out the application using a desktop computer, not a mobile device or tablet. (The recommended browser is Firefox.)

Be sure they select their program(s) of choice at LaGuardia Community College. Applicants will receive an admission decision from each college listed on their application.

STEP 3 Pay the application fee.

After students complete the application, they will be prompted to pay a non-refundable application fee of \$65.

STEP 4 Submit supporting documents.

Students will need their eight-digit CUNY ID number to submit documents to the University Application Processing Center. Please note that letters of recommendation and personal essays are not required for admission to LaGuardia.

Please note:

- If a student is attending an NYC DOE school, they should enter their nine-digit OSIS number in the High School/Secondary section of the admission application, which will enable CUNY to retrieve their transcript electronically. This number is found at the top of the high school transcript.
- If a student has already graduated or did not attend a NYC DOE school, they must send a paper transcript to CUNY.

HOW TO CHECK THE APPLICATION STATUS

After submitting supporting documents, please allow 3-4 weeks for the application status to update. Students must first claim their CUNYfirst account to check the status of their application. Here's how:

Go to cunyfirst.cuny.edu

- On the CUNY Login page, click "New User"
- 2. On the Account Activation page, enter the following:

First Name, Last Name as they appear on the submitted application

Date of Birth ("D.O.B") in mm/dd/yyyy format (example: 01/02/1999)

The last four digits of the student's Social Security Number in the "SS#" field. Applicants who do not have a Social Security Number will be provided a four-digit number via email after they submit their application.

Click the box next to the words "I'm not a robot" and follow the CAPTCHA text prompts.




VISIT US
