Lehman College - Transfer Information

Lehman Transfer Profile

Located on 37 acres in the northwest Bronx, across from the Jerome Park Reservoir and centered along a major educational corridor with five neighboring public schools. Lehman is a liberal arts college in The City University of New York, founded in 1968 and offering 51 undergraduate majors and programs; 46 graduate degree programs; 17 graduate certificates; and 11 doctoral programs in conjunction with the CUNY Graduate Center.

- \rightarrow The *average** student who transfer to Lehman College achieved a cumulative GPA of 2.90.
- → The *average** student who transfers to Lehman College has completed 75.9 credits.
- → Transfer students must have a minimum GPA of 2.30 to be considered for admission.

*Not a minimum requirement, students are routinely admitted with GPA's above and below the average GPA.

Admission Requirements

Take the CUNY Assessment Test (Transfer students who have completed a three credit college-level English or Math course with a grade of C or better are exempt from the CUNY Reading and Writing exams and/or Math exams.)

CUNY Pathways & General Education Requirements

- → If you have earned an Associates of Arts (AA) or an Associates of Science (AS) you are waived from CUNYs common core and half of their individual college option requirements.
- → If you have earned an Associates of Applied Sciences (AAS) you are waived from Pathways courses that you have already completed at LaGuardia Community College.
- → If you have NOT completed an associate's degree, CUNY senior colleges will require you to complete up to 12 credits as part of their college option.

Lehman College - Key Programs and Majors

Health Services Administration B.S. (54 Credit maior)

The program in Health Services Administration provides students with the critical knowledge and skills needed by health services managers who will work with clinicians to manage health care delivery systems, hospitals, organized physician groups, community health facilities, nursing homes, extended care facilities, financing and insurance agencies, and managed care organizations.

Program Minimum Admission Requirements

An application for admission to the program in Health Services Administration requires a cumulative index of 2.5 for admission to the program.

Nursing B.S. (75 Credit Major - Generic Nursing Program)

Program Admission Requirements: To enter the Nursing Program, students must earn a minimum grade of "C" or better in each of the science courses listed below, with a minimum cumulative index of 2.75 in these courses, or their equivalents, and a cumulative index of 2.0 or greater for all college work. Actual admitted students typically have a have a GPA of 3.7 and above (varies according to year and applicant pool)

Pre-requisite Science Courses

- 1. CHE 114 and CHE 115 Essential of General Chemistry Lecture and Lab (4.5 credits)
- 2. CHE 120 and CHE 121 Essentials of Organic Chemistry Lecture and Lab (4.5 credits)
- 3. BIO 181 and BIO 182 Anatomy and physiology ONE and TWO (8 credits)
- 4. HIN 268 Growth and Development (3 credits)
- 5. HIN 269 Analysis and Action for Community Health (3 credits)

Social Work B.A.

All students who wish to become candidates for the B.A. degree in social work shall have completed 48 credits, including <u>SWK 237</u> (Introduction to Social Work) and <u>SOC 166</u> (Fundamentals of Sociology), achieved a minimum cumulative index of 2.7, and submitted an application to the Social Work Program. Actual admitted students typically have a have a GPA of 3.1 and above (varies according to year and applicant pool)
