

# President's Cabinet Meeting Monday, April 19, 2021 9:00 – 10:30 a.m.

- **I.** Campus/CUNY Updates: President Adams thanked the Cabinet for their active participation in the Cabinet retreat. He indicated that he wishes to continue the work to integrate the Gallup Strengths framework into the Cabinet's continuing work.
- II. Review 4/12/2021 Cabinet Meeting Notes: Notes reviewed and no changes noted.

#### III. Enrollment

- a. Update on "Jump Start" Enrollment: VP Seals reported that 16 students have registered for Jump Start which begins on 4/24/21. Outreach efforts to part-time students, stopouts and other populations continues. The Cabinet noted the value of giving students multiple times to start their classes. VP Seals noted that various rules and procedures make it challenging to have multiple starts. Provost Arcario will reach out to BMCC to see how they've implemented their version of Jump Start. President Adams noted that this is a topic for the Enrollment Solutions Working Group to examine and recommend action to the Cabinet.
- b. President Adams noted that he and VP Gupta are working on a modified CUNY Start program for high school students. It would operate like a summer immersion program. A grant of \$10,000 has been provided by the CUNY Central Office to pay for certain faculty costs. The program will engage the Career Services Center and ACE to provide career planning as a wrap-around service for students.
- **IV. Update on Utilization of Study Halls:** VP Erfan reported on the low number of students accessing study halls (see attached). It was noted that faculty, particularly adjuncts, can inform students of the availability of the study halls. Robert indicated that we will work with Student Affairs to place information on student portals and social media about the study hall availability and to inform faculty about promoting this to students.

## V. Update on Fall 2021 Planning

- a. Utilization and Capacity of Classroom Space: VP Erfan discussed information (attached) showing the availability of rooms with a capacity of over 28 seats. An analysis revealed with social distancing of 6-feet that 36% of in-person sections could be accommodated given current space availability and social distancing protocols. This does not include classrooms above the 4<sup>th</sup> floor in the C-Building given concerns about elevator usage. Provost Arcario reminded the Cabinet of the additional costs associated with operating in-person/hybrid classes given more teaching personnel are needed. President Adams noted there are many variables in campus in-person capacity, including the frequency of the use of a classroom, social distancing rules and the class calendar. President Adams noted that our classroom calendar concentrates classes during certain time periods and this clustering may not be advantageous to meet student scheduling needs and address restricted capacity during Covid. Provost Arcario noted he is having ongoing discussions with Chairs regarding scheduling. He also noted previous efforts, around the 30-credit initiative, were put in place to address class availability and this should be revisited to assess continuing impact. Senate Chair Bruns noted that the class schedule is also responsive to when students wish to attend classes.
- VI. Middle States: President Adams requested the Cabinet to reflect on the Middle States selfstudy chapters that were received over the weekend. Provost Arcario noted the high quality of the work. He also indicated that there is streamlining of the document that's needed. In addition, he noted areas, such as with the staff survey, that will require updates as work is done to address an issue. He noted that Standard 5 on Assessment will need to be updated and streamlined. He indicated that it would be valuable to create a chart that shows the PPR/AES feedback loop processes as this will allow the College and reviewers to more easily see how assessment informs future action. Senate Chair Bruns noted the need to address the budget process as there are discrepancies between what is now written and the process. VP Erfan indicated that he will develop a flow chart to better show the process. Faculty Council President Isaac noted that storage of information and a central repository for collecting information is needed. Robert Jaffe noted the frequency in which communications arises in terms of communication to students and communications amongst and within Divisions and Departments. President Adams noted the need to have more information about the work of the Foundation included and that there are areas where work is being done, but the Self-Study may not include that up-to-date information. He noted that work around micro-credentials, AAS degree assessment and the tapping of external expertise (such as the work with the Harvard Business Club of NY and medical billing) area areas where the Self-Study will need updates. In addition, he noted the need to highlight accomplishments with student graduation rates. President Adams indicated that he will look to schedule a Cabinet retreat in June to address Middle States issues.
