These courses do not need to be taken sequentially, so students should enroll in whichever course is offered during their second semester.

## Course Information & Fingerprinting

- ELL101, SSY105, and ELN123 must be taken before ELE203
- ELN123 is only offered in Fall I
- ELE203 is only offered in the 12-week session
- ELE110 is typically not offered in Spring II
- Students must also register for REG1 (Studio hour) at the same time as ELE203

## Pathways Requirements & Transfer

**PATHWAYS REQUIRED CORE (RC)** Pathways is CUNY's general education framework. For Required Core, students must take 2 English courses, 1 Mathematics & Quantitative Reasoning Course, and 1 Life and Physical Sciences course.

**MATHEMATICS AND QUANTITATIVE REASONING** Students should take MAT107/123 if transferring to City College or MAT120/119 if transferring to York College.

**LIFE AND PHYSICAL SCIENCES** Students should take SCB101/SCC101 Topics in Biology or Chemistry if transferring to York. If transferring to City College, students can take SCB101, SCC101, or SCP140 Topics in Astronomy.

**PATHWAYS FLEXIBLE CORE (FC)** allows students to choose courses based on interests, transfer or career plans, or for general exploration. Associate of Arts students must take one course from each category listed below, plus an additional course from any category. Note: your program has specific requirements or recommendations listed below.

- **Creative Expression: HUC106 Public Speaking** recommended if transferring to York
- **Individual & Society: ELS200 Latin American Literature I** recommended if transferring to York; **SSS100 Sociology** recommended if transferring to City College
- **Scientific World: SCG120 Oceanography** or **SCP160 Foundations of Physics** recommended if transferring to City College
- **U.S. Experience in its Diversity: SSP101 Power & Politics** recommended if transferring to York; **SSH101 or 102 Themes in American History** if transferring to City College
- **World Cultures and Global Issues:** No recommendation
- **Additional (Individual & Society): ELS201 Latin American Literature II** recommended if transferring to York

**TRANSFER AGREEMENTS** The Education Associate program has an agreement with the following 4-year colleges. By graduating from LaGuardia and meeting certain requirements, you will be able to complete your studies at a 4-year college and earn a bachelor's degree.
