This articulation agreements positions students for entrance into the Queens College Secondary Education NYS Initial Certification Program-Professional Sequence¹.

Admission requirements for senior college program (e.g., minimum GPA, audition/portfolio):

As per Queens College's Guidelines:

To be accepted into the Secondary Education program, a student must have met the following requirements:

- 1. A grade of B is required in one course in each of the NYS Core Areas (English, Social Science, Math, and Physical Sciences); no grade lower than a C is acceptable in the program and is not transferable.
- 2. Grade of B or better required in ENG101 or ENG102 taken at LaGuardia CC
- 3. Students are required to take particular courses in some areas of the Pathways Flexible Core in order to fulfill requirements. If students do not take the suggested courses in the Pathways Flexible Core, they will have to take additional credits to complete their degree requirements at Queens College.
- 4. Grade of B or better required in ELN 122, SSY105, ELE 204,
- 5. All students must successfully complete two (2) writing-intensive classes (designated "WI") to fulfill degree requirements.

The initial certification for teaching from Queens College comes as a result of having a content area declared major (English, Science, History, Mathematics or a World Language) and declaring a co-major in Education at Queens College. It is imperative that students work closely with

advisors at LaGuardia and at Queens to streamline the transfer process.

At LaGuardia, students will complete 9 hours of Education courses equivalent to

- SEYS 201W Historical, Social and Philosophical Foundations of Education (3 credits)
- SEYS 221 Development and Learning in Middle Childhood and Adolescence (3 credits)
- SEYS 340 Language, Literacy, and Culture in Education (3 credits)

As well as up to 9 hours of their chosen content major with courses chosen from the approved courses provided by Queens College SEYS department program coordinators with equivalent courses at LaGuardia CC.

The other 42 credits to be taken at LaGuardia will be to complete the AA Degree as defined by the Secondary Education option.

For Initial NYC Certification Secondary Education (Grades 7-12) students must:

- ➤ Complete the courses, Initial Clinical Experience (ICE) and Student Teaching requirements of the Secondary Ed 7-12 Initial Certification Program
- > Complete a co-major in an approved liberal arts or science area
- > Satisfy all Queens College graduation requirements
- ➤ Complete state-approved seminars of Child Abuse Identification, School Violence Intervention and Prevention; and Dignity for All Students Act.
- ➤ Pass the NYS Certification Exams: Content Specialty Test (CST), Educating All Students (EAS) and the Teacher Performance Assessment (edTPA)

Procedures for reviewing, up-dating, modifying or terminating agreement:

- This agreement is effective for three academic years from the date of implementation (Effective Date below). Unless it is renewed in the third year, the agreement will expire.
- When any of the programs within this agreement undergo any changes relevant to this agreement, the agreement will be reviewed and revised as necessary by the Curriculum Committees of both the sending and receiving program. Minimally, the agreement will be reviewed at least once a year with particular attention directed to any curricular changes at the sending and/or receiving departments.

Procedures for evaluating agreement, e.g., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success:

Both the Advising Offices and the Institutional Effectiveness Offices from each campus will keep data on the academic progress of the transfer student

Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement, e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisers, Websites, etc.:

- Notices of Articulation will be placed in respective catalogues, recruiting brochures, and websites
- Respective Transfer and Academic Advisors will be informed about and provided copies of this
- Members of the Senior College Enrollment Management Division will have this agreement and attend recruitment events at the Sending Institution.

Additional information regarding General Education:

- This agreement is deemed to be consistent with the CUNY Pathways General Education curriculum, and will be updated whenever necessary in keeping with changes in the Pathways curriculum.
- General Education at Queens College requires up to a total of twelve (12) credits of additional Pathways classes as part of the College Option. (This number is reduced to six (6) credits for students who have completed their Associate's Degree.)
- In addition, all students must take three (3) Writing Intensive (W) classes. (This number is reduced to two (2) classes for students who have completed their Associate's Degree.) A number of Pathway's classes at Oueens College are also W classes, and most majors include one or more W classes, so the writing requirement need not add additional general education credits.
- Finally, there is a residency requirement: Students must complete at least 45 credits on Queens College campus to earn a Queens College degree.
