Tips for Writing Your Foundation Scholarship Personal Statement

Prior to filling out your LaGuardia Community College Foundation Scholarship application, it is important that you first review the application requirements here and please read this document thoroughly. The personal statement you submit should reflect your voice, experiences, and what motivates you.

General Tips and Suggestions

- Please note if you are an F1 visa student, you first must visit the ISS office
 (International Student Services) in Room B-117 to get approved before applying online
- Please do not use any artificial intelligence (e.g. ChatGPT, Grammarly, SiteGBT, Google AI)
- Write your letter in a clear and well-constructed format
- Express enthusiasm and authenticity about your background, family life, college program and academic achievements
- Keep your personal statement to 3 paragraphs between 200 to 250 words
- Speak to why you are attending LAGCC and describe your extracurricular activities
 (e.g. clubs, honors activities, mentorships, athletics and community volunteering)
- Express the unique qualities that make you stand out from the crowd
- Contact the Writing Center in B-200 before submitting your essay
- Discuss your future career goals and how can the foundation scholarship assist you in this effort
- Write in the present or active tense as if you are manifesting the award

It is important that you use this opportunity to express *your story* through a literary picture as a person, student, and future LAGCC scholarship candidate. Do this by highlighting your skills, accomplishments, future aspirations.
