Pathways Requirements & Transfer

PATHWAYS REQUIRED CORE (RC) Pathways is CUNY's general education framework. For Required Core, students must take 2 English courses, 1 Mathematics and Quantitative Reasoning course, and 1 Life and Physical Sciences course. For more details visit the Pathways Required Core website.

MATHEMATICS AND QUANTITATIVE REASONING
Early Childhood Education students should take
MAT115 or 117 to meet NY State Teacher Education
requirements. This course is also recommended by
Queens College for students who will transfer there.

<u>LIFE AND PHYSICAL SCIENCES</u> Students should take SCB101 or SCC101 Topics in Biology or Chemistry. These courses meet NY State Teacher Education requirements and anticipate requirements for those transferring.

<u>PATHWAYS FLEXIBLE CORE (FC)</u> allows students to choose courses based on interests, transfer or career plans, or for general exploration. Associate of Arts students must take one course from each category listed below, plus an additional course from any category.
