

Pathways Requirements & Transfer

PATHWAYS REQUIRED CORE (RC) Pathways is CUNY's general education framework. For Required Core, students must take 2 English courses, 1 Mathematics and Quantitative Reasoning course, and 1 Life and Physical Sciences course. For more details, including a list of Life and Physical Sciences courses, visit the Pathways Required Core website.

MATHEMATICS AND QUANTITATIVE REASONING For students who plan to transfer to St. John's for a BS in Hospitality Management, MAT115/117 Algebra & Statistics is recommended. For students who plan to transfer to City Tech for a B.Tech in Hospitality Management, MAT120 Statistics is recommended. Note that MAT119 may not transfer to City Tech. Speak to an advisor for more support.

PATHWAYS FLEXIBLE CORE (FC) allows students to choose courses based on interests, transfer or career plans, or for general exploration. Associate of Science students must take one course from each category listed below, plus an additional course from any category. View DegreeWorks or the Pathways website to see a full range of options, or talk with the program director or an advisor.
