MATHEMATICS AND QUANTITATIVE REASONING Depending on placement, you may take Math \& the Modern World/Problem Solving (MAT107 or 123); Algebra \& Trigonometry (MAT115 or 117); or Statistics (MAT120 or 119). Speak to an advisor to determine which math course may be right for you.
