Psychology Option 1 (Select 1): **SSY200** Personality, **SSY205** Psychology of Women or **SSY241** Developmental Psychology II

Psychology Option 2 (Select 1): **SSN184** Environmental Psychology or **SSN280** Urban Black Psychology (**Note: It is recommended that students take SSY250 during the same semester as SSN184 or SSN280 if possible**)

Unrestricted Elective (3 credits): **SSY203** Experiential Learning in Psychology or choose other course

Pathways Requirements & Transfer

PATHWAYS REQUIRED CORE (RC) Pathways is CUNY's general education framework. For Required Core, students must take 2 English courses, 1 Mathematics and Quantitative Reasoning course, and 1 Life and Physical Sciences course. MATHEMATICS AND QUANTITATIVE REASONING It is recommended to take MAT120/119 Statistics for your program because it is needed for the study of social sciences, including Psychology. Speak to an advisor if you have questions about which math course may be right for you.

Associate of Arts students must take one course from each category listed below, plus an additional course from any category.
