Program Core Courses

History Course Option (Select 1): SSH101 Themes in American History to 1865; SSH102 Themes in American History since 1865; SSH103 Western Civilization from Ancient Times to the Renaissance; SSH104 Western Civilization from the Renaissance to Modern Times; SSH105 World History from Ancient Times to 1500; SSH106 World History from 1500 to the Present; SSH110 East Asia Civilization and Societies; SSH231 Afro-American History; SSH232 Survey of Latin American and Caribbean History

<u>Unrestricted Elective</u> (3 credits): Students may take any course they choose. Recommended courses include **SSY203** Experiential Learning in Psychology if they find a faculty member to work with on an agreed upon project. Once a faculty member approves, the student is registered in the course by the College (student does not register on their own). Students may also consider **SSY112** Intro to Disability or **SCG252** Animal Behavior & Ethics.

Pathways Requirements & Transfer

PATHWAYS REQUIRED CORE (RC) Pathways is CUNY's general education framework. For Required Core, students must take 2 English courses, 1 Mathematics and Quantitative Reasoning course, and 1 Life and Physical Sciences course. For more details, including a list of Life and Physical Sciences courses, visit the Pathways Required Core website.

MATHEMATICS AND QUANTITATIVE REASONING It is recommended to take MAT120/119 Statistics for your program because it is needed for the study of social sciences, including Psychology. Speak to an advisor if you have questions about which math course may be right for you.

<u>PATHWAYS FLEXIBLE CORE (FC)</u> allows students to choose courses based on interests, transfer or career plans, or for general exploration. Associate of Arts students must take one course from each category listed below, plus an additional course from any category.
