Admission requirements for senior college program (e.g., minimum GPA, audition/portfolio):

As per Brooklyn College's Guidelines:

To be accepted into the early childhood education program, a student must have met the following requirements:

- 1. Completed English 1010 and 1020, with a C or better.
- 2. Completed at least AA degree with a GPA of 2.80 or higher. Students are required to receive B or above in the following education courses: ELN 121 Foundations of Early Childhood Education, SSY 105 Learning and Education, ELE 110 Arts In Education, ELN 206 Family, School & Community in Early Childhood Education, ELE 205 Language and Literacy in Early Childhood Education, and HUC 116 Survey of Speech, Language & Hearing Disorders.
- 3. Pass the ECAE department Math proficiency exam with a score of 80% or higher. This exam is composed of 35 questions about Number and Operations, Geometry and Spatial Sense, Measurement, Data Interpretation and Probability, and Algebra and Patterns. Students need to get 28 questions correct to pass it. This proficiency exam is co-administered by the Department of Early Childhood and Art Education and the Office of Testing at Brooklyn College.
- 4. Students who did not take a precalculus course at LaGuardia Community College or elsewhere or took the course but did not meet Brooklyn College's standards will have to take MATH 1006 at Brooklyn College.
- 5. Pass ECAE department English exam.
- 6. Finger printing must be completed and cleared.
- 7. Purchase ePortfolio software after being accepted to Brooklyn.
