

**Articulation Agreement with City College of New York, City University of New York
Associate of Arts (AA) Degree in Bilingual Education**

1. SENDING AND RECEIVING INSTITUTIONS

2. ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR SENIOR COLLEGE PROGRAM:

1. Completion of A.A. degree.
2. A grade of C or better in all courses is required in order to ensure that the City College of New York School of Education awards transfer credit.
3. City College of New York GPA of 2.5 or higher.
4. Pass the School of Education Admissions Test (S.E.A.T) administered by the School of Education.
5. Completion of twelve credits at the City College of New York with at least three credits in Education.
6. Complete a satisfactory interview and on-site essay with program faculty at the City College of New York.
7. Completion of recommended courses in "pathways required" and "flexible core" at LaGuardia Community College. *If students do not take courses recommended in "pathways required" and "flexible core" at LaGuardia Community College, they may have to take additional courses to complete degree requirements at the City College of New York.*
8. Demonstrated proficiency in Spanish or other language deemed as a high-needs language by the New York City Department of Education.
9. Declare an approved College of Liberal Arts and Sciences co-major or School of Education interdisciplinary concentration at the City College of New York^a.

^aLiberal Arts Major Requirements:

New York State requires that individuals seeking childhood teacher certification complete a liberal arts major in addition to their preparation in education. Students may complete a traditional liberal arts major (art, economics, English, history, music, political science, psychology, sociology, Spanish) or they may complete a special interdisciplinary major designed specifically for those preparing to be elementary teachers. There are nine interdisciplinary concentration areas: biology, earth science, chemistry, mathematics, elementary mathematics, theater in its cultural context, art in its cultural context, language and literature, and social studies. Those preparing to be elementary school teachers should consult with a City College of New York advisor to select an appropriate liberal arts major.

- Courses used to satisfy Part A: Liberal Arts requirements at the City College of New York should be selected under the consultation of a City College of New York academic advisor.

For initial New York State Certification in Bilingual Childhood Education (Grades 1-6) students must:


- Complete courses, practicum, and portfolio requirements of the Bilingual Childhood Education (Grades 1-6) Initial Certification Program.
- Complete a co-major in a New York State approved liberal arts and sciences area.
- Satisfy all City College of New York graduation requirements.
- Complete all state approved professional development seminars including but not limited to child abuse identification, school violence prevention and Dignity for All Students (DASA) training.
- Pass all current New York State Certification Exams including but not limited to the Academic Literacy Skills Test (ALST), Education All Students (EAS), Content Specialty Test- Multi-subject (CST-Multi-subject Childhood), Bilingual Education Assessment (BEA), and edTPA.


5. ARTICULATION AGREEMENT FOLLOW-UP PROCEDURES


1. Procedures for reviewing, updating, modifying or terminating agreement:
This agreement will be reviewed and revised four years after its effective date or should either of the degree programs involved in this agreement undergo a change before then, the agreement will be reviewed and revised accordingly by faculty from each institution's respective departments, selected by their chairpersons/program directors.


2. Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement, e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisers, websites, etc.: This articulation agreement will be publicized on the websites of both the sending and receiving institutions. Transfer advisors at the sending institution will promote this agreement with eligible students.
