### **1. Procedures for reviewing, updating, modifying or terminating agreement:**

When either of the degree programs involved in this agreement undergoes a change, the agreement will be reviewed and revised accordingly by representatives from each institution's respective departments, selected by their chairpersons/program directors.

### **2. Procedures for evaluating agreement, i.e., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success:**


Each semester John Jay will provide LAG with the following information: a) the number of LAG students who applied to the program; b) the number of LAG students who were accepted into the program; c) the number of LAG students who enrolled; and d) the aggregate GPA of these enrolled students.

### **3. Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement, e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisers, Websites, etc.:**


This articulation agreement will be publicized on the LAG website, and on John Jay's website. Transfer advisers at LAG will promote this agreement with eligible students.
