Articulation Agreement with York College, City University of New York Associate of Arts (AA) Degree in Bilingual Education

Purpose: York College and LaGuardia Community College (LAGCC) hereby enter into this agreement to facilitate the opportunity for students who wish to transfer from LAGCC with an Associate of Arts degree in the Bilingual Child to York College's Spanish Childhood Bilingual Education program in the Department of Teacher Education.

This agreement is pursuant to the following details in Sections A through E as follows:

A. ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR SENIOR COLLEGE PROGRAM:

Students who graduate from LAGCC with an Associate of Arts in The Bilingual Child will have fulfilled all Lower Division General Education requirements for the York College Bachelor of Arts degree in Bilingual Education. Admission to the senior college program include the following requirements:

- 1. Minimum overall GPA of 3.0 at time of admission
- 2. Completion of the pre-major block¹ with an average GPA of 3.0 at York College and/or LaGCC (LaGCC course equivalents in brackets { })
 - English 126 (3 credits) {ENG 102: Writing Through Literature}
 - Philosophy 202 or Sociology 202: Major Ideas and Issues in Education (WI) (3 credits)
 {ELN120: Foundations of American Education Grades 1-6}
 - o Mathematics 271: Topics in Foundational Math (4 credits)
 - Education 280: Child and Adolescent Development for Teachers (3 credits) {SSY105:
 Learning and Education: Childhood to Adolescents}
 - o Education 230: Teaching with Multimedia Technology (2 credits)
- 3. Complete the Department's Writing Workshop
- 4. Submit the Program Admission Application to the Dept. of Teacher Education at YC
- Complete background check and fingerprinting, and receive clearance through NYC Department of Education
- 6. Students cannot have an INC grade on their transcript at the time of admission

¹ Per the agreement, LAGCC students will transfer to York with English 126, Philosophy/Sociology 202, and Education 280. They are **encouraged** to take Math 271 and Education 230 at York prior to graduation from LAGCC.

7. Declaration of an appropriate Liberal Arts & Sciences major (Candidates enrolled in the Childhood Education with Bilingual Extension program major in Spanish) at York College.

Total transfer credits granted toward the baccalaureate degree: <u>60 credits</u>

Total additional credits required at the senior college to complete baccalaureate degree: <u>60 credits</u>

Total credits required for the baccalaureate degree: 120

B. RETENTION REQUIREMENTS FOR SENIOR COLLEGE

Students meet with an advisor in Teacher Education each semester in order to monitor candidate progress and ensure adequate yearly progress towards graduation. Advisors review with candidates their academic achievements as well as discuss progress towards certification requirements including progress towards certification exams. Workshops and some financial supports are offered to candidates to facilitate candidates being fully eligible for the NYS initial teaching license upon graduation.

Students in the Bilingual Education program who are paraprofessionals and proficient in Spanish are eligible to join the NYC DOE Bilingual Pupil Services (BPS) after the 75th credit. BPS pays for 9 credits per semester. As an affiliate of BPS, York hosts BPS workshops and application sessions each semester for potential participants.

Students may be dismissed from a Teacher Education program under any of the following conditions:

- Grade-point average in any area (Education, Content Area/Major, Overall) falls below the required 3.0 GPA for progression
- Student has received one or more grades below B in any Professional Education course
- Student has received two or more grades below C in any Major course
- Student has committed a substantial violation of CUNY's Academic Integrity Policy
- Student has been reported two or more times for unprofessional conduct by faculty or staff from York College and/or partner schools/sites

Students who are dismissed may be given a remediation plan if the student shows signs of potential improvement and/or has demonstrated extenuating circumstances that have impacted their academic progress.

E. ARTICULATION AGREEMENT FOLLOW-UP PROCEDURES

1. Procedures for reviewing, updating, modifying or terminating agreement:

This agreement will be reviewed and revised two years after its effective date or should either of the degree programs involved in this agreement undergo a change before then, the agreement will be reviewed and revised accordingly by faculty from each institution's respective departments, selected by their chairpersons/program directors.

Changes to Agreement:

Neither party may change this agreement unilaterally. Proposed changes in policies and curricula (i.e. admission, curriculum and degree requirements, course numbers, and/or course content) must be communicated in writing to the other party, and jointly agreed upon in consultation with the relevant officials of each institution. Any changes agreed upon must be signed, dated, and attached to this original agreement. Either party may cancel this agreement by notifying the other party no less than one academic year before the intended date of cancellation.

Notice of Cancellation:

Either party may independently cancel this agreement by notifying the other party no less than one academic year before the intended date of cancellation.

2. Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement, e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisers, websites, etc.:

This articulation agreement will be publicized on the websites of both the sending and receiving institutions. Transfer advisors at the sending institution will promote this agreement with eligible students.
