# B. ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR SENIOR COLLEGE PROGRAM

(e.g., minimum GPA- overall and/or in particular subjects, audition/portfolio)

Students who graduate from the LaGuardia Community College with an Associate in Psychology will have fulfilled all Lower Division General Education requirements for the York College Baccalaureate in Psychology. Students will be required to meet New York State Liberal Arts requirements and all elective requirements to achieve 120 credits. Students will be required to meet the New York State residency requirement for the Psychology Major at York (50% of the credits taken in the Psychology Major).

Total transfer credits granted toward the baccalaureate degree: 60.

Total additional credits required at York College to complete baccalaureate degree: 60

Total additional credits required at York College to complete the Psychology Major (These credits are counted toward the 60 credits required at York College to complete the baccalaureate degree.): 21

#### PURPOSE

York College and LaGuardia Community College (LGCC) hereby enter into this agreement to facilitate an opportunity for students who wish to transfer from LGCC's Associate of Science degree in Psychology to York College's Bachelor of Arts degree in Psychology. This agreement specifies the conditions and requirements necessary for LGCC students to transfer to York College with no loss of credit.

#### **CHANGES**

Neither party may change this agreement unilaterally. Proposed changes in policies or curricula by either party must be communicated in writing to the other party and agreed upon in consultation with relevant officials of each institution. Any changes agreed upon must be signed, dated, and attached to this agreement.

### NOTICE OF CANCELLATION

Either party may independently cancel this agreement by notifying the other party no less than one academic year before the intended date of cancellation

### ARTICULATION AGREEMENT FOLLOW-UP PROCEDURES

1. Procedures for reviewing, updating, modifying or terminating agreement:

LaGuardia Community College faculty and York College faculty will review and analyze the strength of the curriculum and the success of students on an annual basis as part of their annual assessment activities. Modifications will be made as required.

When either of the programs undergo changes, this articulation agreement will be reviewed and revised as necessary by one or two faculty members from the relevant department of each institution.

2. Procedures for evaluating agreement, i.e., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success:

The CUNY Institutional Research Database will be used to track performance (in terms of credit accumulation and GPA) and persistence (in terms of retention and graduation) of all LaGuardia Community College students who transfer to CUNY Senior Colleges.

3. Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement, e.g., college catalogs, transfer adviser, websites, etc.:

LaGuardia Community College and York College will collaborate in publicizing this agreement on their websites and in their catalogs. They will share brochures and other marketing materials including web-based promotions. Transfer advisors will be made aware of this agreement and will have available all necessary materials to publicize the agreement to the students with whom they work.
