### Transfer to Queens College

Students graduating from LaGuardia with an AA in TESOL/Linguistics will be able to enroll in the Bachelor of Arts degree in Applied Linguistics: TESOL at Queens College.

Students eligible for transfer to Queens College need an overall GPA of at least 2.75 on a 4.0 scale. Students must demonstrate written academic English proficiency by passing the program's English Language Proficiency Test (ELPT) or by providing proof of one of the following external test results: a New York State ELA Regents grade of 85 or greater, a Writing and Language SAT score of 550 or greater, or an English ACT score of 11 or greater.

# **Pathways Requirements**

PATHWAYS REQUIRED CORE (RC) Pathways is CUNY's general education framework. For Required Core, students must take 2 English courses, 1 Mathematics and Quantitative Reasoning course, and 1 Life and Physical Sciences course. For more details, including a list of Life and Physical Sciences courses, visit the Pathways Required Core website.

#### MATHEMATICS AND QUANTITATIVE REASONING

TESOL/Linguistics students should take MAT115 or 117 to meet NY State Teacher Education requirements. This course is also recommended by Queens College for students who will transfer there.

<u>PATHWAYS FLEXIBLE CORE (FC)</u> allows students to choose courses based on interests, transfer or career plans, or for general exploration. Associate of Arts students must take one course from each category listed below, plus an additional course from any category. View DegreeWorks or the <u>Pathways website</u> to see a full range of options, or talk with the program director or an advisor. <u>Note: your program has specific requirements or recommendations listed below</u>.

- <u>Creative Expression</u>: HUT101 Art of Theatre required as it is a pre-requisite for HUC115
- Individual & Society: CSE110 Literacy & Propaganda recommended because course aligns with TESOL accrediting standards
- Scientific World: SSY101 General Psychology recommended for those transferring to Linguistics programs
- U.S. Experience in its Diversity: SSH101 American History I required for ELN122, satisfies NYS Teacher education requirements, and recommended by Queens College
- World Cultures and Global Issues: Modern
   Language (satisfies NYS Teacher Education requirement) or EIS216 International Schooling (aligns with TESOL accrediting standards)
- Additional (U.S. Experience): SSH102 American History II – satisfies NYS Teacher Education requirements and recommended by Queens College

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
