Pressuring Someone (Sexual Harassment)

To meet for lunch/dinner/drinks or to date; To accept social media invitations; To trade sexual favors for good grades, academic advancement or other benefits.

Unwanted Attention

(Sexual Harassment/ Gender-Based Harassment)

Suggestive comments, teasing, jokes or catcalls; mocking or disparaging comments about gender identity; sexually explicit electronic communications; Undue and unwanted attention like inappropriate flirting or staring.

Sexual Violence

Rape or attempted rape; Dating violence and Domestic/Intimate Partner violence; Stalking.
