Overview of findings, analysis, recommendations and future initiatives

Results & analysis

In the 2022-2023 assessment year, External Affairs increased the total number of community groups that were engaged with, from 14 (in 2021-2022) to 23. However, in the same period's comparison, the number for elected officials and government entities engaged with decreased from 79 to 61. For both components combined, there was an overall decrease from 93 to 84. While this falls short of expectations, it is likely attributed to a reduced staff—there was only one full-time staff member while another was on family leave for 15 weeks, and only one part-time student assistant to support outreach while the prior year had two.

Recommendations and future initiatives

In the 2023-2024 assessment period the goal is to reach 70 elected official/government officials and 20 community organizations. This is based on this year's tracked engagements and anticipated staffing levels.

Results & analysis

NYC Council Discretionary Expense Funding remained the same, \$1.230 million, from July 2021- June 2022 (received in FY23) to the current reporting year, July 2022- June 2023 (received in FY24).

NYC Council Discretionary Capital Funding decreased in this assessment period from \$7 million to \$3 million.

In the assessment period \$250,000 in discretionary NYS Assembly Capital Funding were allotted and are received in FY24.

In the prior assessment period, more funds were allotted than were allotted; in this assessment period, July 2022- June 2023, slightly less funds were allotted than were requested.

Recommendations and future initiatives

In the 2023-2024 assessment period the goal is to maintain levels of funds received.

Overall summary
