





Computer and Network Service Technician Certificate Program


Do you work well under pressure? Do you like helping people solve problems? Are you able to manage multiple priorities? Do you work well under pressure? Do you like helping people solve problems? Are you able to manage multiple priorities?

Prepare for entry level roles in the field of computer repair and networking. Computer Network Support Specialists, also known as IT Support or Help Desk Technicians, play a critical role in maintaining business computer operations and meeting the tech support needs of organizations. They analyze and troubleshoot computer network problems and may assist computer users through phone, email or in-person visits. This program also prepares you for the industry recognized CompTIA A+ certification exam. For more information call (718) 482-7244. ND

Computer and Network Service Technician - Civic Hall

Jumpstart your tech career! Get training in entry level computer and network support roles while you prepare for the industry recognized CompTIA A+ certification. You will learn to install, configure and maintain PCs, mobile devices and software for end users; explore basics of networking and security forensics; properly and safely diagnose, resolve and document common hardware and software issues; and discuss basics of scripting, virtualization, desktop imaging and deployment. General topics include hardware and network troubleshooting, operating systems, operational procedures, security, virtualization and cloud computing, and software troubleshooting. Upon successful completion of this course, you can take the CompTIA A+ exam and will receive an exam voucher. You will also earn a LaGuardia certificate of completion and may qualify for an internship or job placement assistance. Prerequisite: High school diploma or equivalency as well as English proficiency in order to fully participate and succeed in class. (Cost of textbook and virtual lab included in course fee.) Finding more opportunities for education at LaGuardia

Demaire Dowdy began his post secondary education at LaGuardia, graduating in 2010 as a Liberal Arts: Math & Science major. He went on to graduate from Texas College in 2013 as a biology major, participating in two medical

research projects during and after that time. After taking part in the NYC Teaching Fellows Program, Demaire earned a master degree from Brooklyn College in 2017 and then completed a second master degree program in Public Administration at Baruch College in 2021.

Transitioning this past summer from the position of special education teacher to full-time technology teacher for 9th and 10th graders at Information Technology High School in Long Island City, Demaire came back to the college where his journey began to get ready for this new role. He enrolled in LaGuardia's Computer and Network Service Technician Certificate Program, which prepares students for the CompTIA A+ industry certification, in order to enhance his knowledge.

He wanted to be able to teach his students how to disassemble and reassemble a computer and about specific operating systems, like Windows 11.

"After I completed the program in October, I started to integrate what I learned over the summer into lessons for my computer fundamentals and cybersecurity classes," says Demaire. "I want to bring more technology opportunities to my students." He plans to further his own tech studies by taking LaGuardia's Cybersecu-

rity Specialist course to prepare for the CompTIA S+ certification, opening up more learning and career opportunities for himself, as well.


Cybersecurity and Privacy Management

Data Analytics and Data Science Program

The ability to gather, prepare, analyze and display data is one of the most sought-after skill sets in the information technology marketplace, with demand spanning across sectors that include healthcare, finance, retail, real estate and even gaming. This program offers beginner, intermediate and advanced level data analytics courses, which may be taken individually or as part of a series. Earn a LaGuardia certificate in Data Analytics by completing Data Analytics Foundations; Python for Data Analytics; Data, Databases and SQL; and Data Visualization with Tableau. You can also earn a LaGuardia certificate in Advanced Data Analytics by completing Data Science: Predictive Analytics. In addition, individual intermediate and advanced level courses will be offered throughout the year covering in-demand topics. These include TensorFlow Certificate Prep, Power BI, and more. Tax Preparer Certificate Program

Earn extra money by becoming a registered tax preparer or learn to prepare taxes for personal use. Upon completion of this course, you will be able to complete basic individual NY State and federal forms. This program is designed for students new to tax preparation.

Tax Return Preparer

Explore the role and responsibilities of a professional tax preparer. Learn how to prepare basic individual forms, including tax credits, deductions, and tax consequences. You will become familiar with the 1040 series, NYS IT 201, and wage income forms. Upon completion of this course you should be able to complete individual taxes for yourself or someone else and will earn a LaGuardia certificate of completion. No software required. Healthcare-Clinical

These courses may be eligible for Veterans tuition assistance. Students who have served in the military also qualify for many services through LaGuardia's Veterans Resource Center. Contact (718) 482-5231 or ddaza@lagcc.cuny.edu.

Certified Clinical Medical Assistant (CCMA)

The CCMA is an essential member of the medical care team who assists the physician with procedures such as taking vital signs, preparing patients for medical procedures, and performing phlebotomy (blood drawing) and electrocardiography (EKG). To take the national certification exam for Clinical Medical Assistant, you must successfully pass all five courses in this program: Medical Terminology, American Heart Association CPR for Healthcare Providers with First Aid, EKG Technician, Phlebotomy, and CCMA Procedures. You may take the courses in any order, or you may take them individually, except CCMA Procedures. To register for CCMA Procedures you must first successfully complete either EKG Technician or Phlebotomy. LaGuardia's CCMA Program currently has a 98% pass rate for students taking the National Healthcareer Association (NHA) CCMA exam. Attendance at an orientation session and passing an online reading exam are required before registration for EKG Technician and Phlebotomy and are recommended before beginning the 5-course CCMA series. A high school diploma or equivalency is a prerequisite for NHA certifications and often a requirement for jobs in the field. Program courses not offered this guarter will be offered in a future guarter. To apply, complete the application form at https://laguardia.edu/ccmaapply. Full and partial tuition scholarships are available for eligible students, and a separate application process is required. Contact CCMA@lagcc.cuny.edu for more information. ND

American Heart Association (AHA) CPR for Healthcare Providers with First Aid (On Campus)

Learn how to save a life using CPR, airway adjuncts and defibrillators and how to rescue victims of a choking emergency. Respond with proper first aid techniques for medical and trauma emergencies. Skills and knowledge will be tested according to American Heart Association (AHA) criteria for Basic Cardiac Life Support (BLS) certification. You will receive two AHA textbooks and AHA certification in BLS CPR for Healthcare Providers and AED. Required for CCMA students who are not already CPR certified. ND

Become a certified EKG technician. Explore the anatomy and physiology of the heart, modern EKG techniques, basic EKG interpretation, and new techniques in cardiac monitoring. Discover the relationship between EKG interpretation, disease states, and commonly used medications. You will learn how to prep patients; take vital signs; set up an EKG machine; and perform electrocardiograms. Successful completion allows you to take the national EKG Technician certification exam. Become a certified phlebotomist. Learn about the anatomy and physiology of the venous system as well as phlebotomy practices. Develop your skills in a variety of blood collection techniques while employing universal precautions: vacuum collection, dermal punctures, and using syringes and butterfly needles. A minimum of 35 live blood draws are required during the practical skills labs. Successful completion of this course allows you to take the national phlebotomy technician certification exam. ND

Learning the value of peer mentoring

Nicole Hamilton was working at a non-profit organization serving formerly incarcerated people before she joined LaGuardia's Mental Health Peer Specialist (MHPS) Training

Program. She wanted to gain more knowledge

and obtain credentials that would make her better suited to serve clients' needs and understood that formal training would help her achieve this and open up career opportunities.

The MHPS Training Program, which teaches people with lived experience with mental health challenges and recovery how to become a mental health peer support worker in the human services sector, was a perfect fit for Nicole. The program provides classroom instruction, an internship for practical experience, and preparation for provisional certification from the New York Peer Specialist

Certification Board. In addition, students receive a loaner laptop, headphones and the required books and materials as well as a stipend for successfully completing the program and internship.

After finishing the didactic portion of the program, Nicole completed an internship at Jamaica Hospital Medical Center, where she was then hired as a Comprehensive Psychiatric Emergency Program (CPEP) Peer Bridger Supervisor.

"I gained a better understanding of the impact from the stigma of mental illness. I realize now that mental illness can affect anyone at any time," says Nicole. "Recognizing that people can live and lead productive lives despite a mental health diagnosis motivated me to use my own lived experience to help others still living with a diagnosis. Training plus the internship is a good way to reintroduce people with lived experience back into the workforce."



Justine Figueroa came to CUNY Start, an intensive college preparation program that focuses on reading, writing and math skills as well as success strategies, to get the confidence she needed before delving into her degree studies. "What really helped me was the support of the teachers

and staff, and I knew that I wanted to implement that in my

Human Services major," says Justine. "I made sure that I asked questions and followed up with advisors. When I left CUNY Start, I created a plan so that I basically had an idea of what I wanted to achieve for myself."

This foundation helped Justine succeed in college. She made Dean's List every semester and received a Guttman Scholarship to help pay for her studies at a four-year school after graduating from LaGuardia. She also gained the self-confidence to become a Peer Advisor at LaGuardia, which entailed helping fellow students understand program curricula as well as sharing knowledge and resources to assist them in navigating the college.

At Hunter College, Justine completed internships with Meals on Wheels and Visiting Nurse Service of New York, working with individuals with substance abuse issues at the latter. She also conducted empowerment and mentoring workshops for incarcerated youth at

Rikers Island before graduating with a Bachelor of Social Work Degree. She plans to continue working to help people through social justice and community organizing, with a particular interest in human rights issues.

Reflecting on her time at LaGuardia, Justine says, "It was a great experience because you had individuals who wanted to help you become your best self, and they would hold you accountable. This was a lesson for me."

Discounts

The Division of Adult & Continuing Education (ACE) offers discounts to the following groups: 30% tuition discount is offered to alumni association members, LaGuardia undergraduates, senior citizens (65+ years), faculty/staff and the families of faculty/staff. 30% tuition discount is offered to the children of undergraduates and to the children of faculty/staff. 50% tuition discount is offered to public assistance recipients. Only one discount can be applied per course. Discounts and waivers apply to all courses except those designated ND.

Delinquent Payments

Refund Policy

For courses under \$299

- 100% (-\$20 per course) if written request received 3 business days prior to 1st day of class - 50% (-\$20 per course) if written request received prior to second week of classes

For courses \$299 and above or more than 50 hours of instruction

- 100% (-\$20 per course) if written request received 3 business days prior to 1st day of class
- 75% (-\$20 per course) if written request received prior to completion of 10% of class hours
- 50% (-\$20 per course) if written request received prior to completion of 20% of class hours

\$20 will be deducted from refunds as shown above up to a limit of \$40. Allow 4-6 weeks to receive refunds for payment made by check or cash. Allow 2 billing cycles for credit charges to reflect refund on monthly statements. Credit Card/Debit Card payments are refunded back to the original card used at time of purchase.
